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Background

For the last 40 years, supplemental oxygen therapy has been a mainstay treatment for millions of people of all ages living with respiratory problems. Individuals rely upon oxygen therapy to relieve symptoms like breathlessness and limited activity caused by chronic problems like COPD, as well as more acute conditions like pneumonia and sleep problems. Despite its ability to add years to people's lives and life to their years, advancements in oxygen therapy technology have been very slow to happen.

The COVID-19 pandemic has worsened the problem by increasing the demand for oxygen equipment as well as straining supply chains. Many people who could benefit from oxygen therapy do not use it as prescribed because of the inconvenience, the cost, and the stigma that can be attached to it.

Our Purpose

There are simply too many systemic challenges for people to use oxygen therapy effectively to live their best lives. World Oxygen Day was created to change that.

By empowering oxygen-user perspectives and experiences, and by providing opportunities for collaboration with providers, we know that we can raise the importance of oxygen therapy – and its challenges – to stakeholders globally in order to make oxygen therapy more acceptable, accessible, and affordable for users around the entire world.



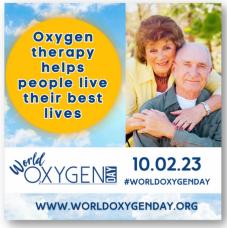
